COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

Reduce your speed!

Did you know if you hit someone at 30mph, there is a 90% chance they will survive?

If you hit them at 40mph, there is a 90% chance they will **DIE**.

I've worked out if you come off Lynn Road and drive down all the way through Tilney All Saints to the Village Hall, the extra 10mph would save you 30 seconds. Put that 30 seconds into perspective, it would take you longer to decide what to do with the extra time!

To encourage safer driving, the Parish Council are introducing 30mph road markings, just after entering the village, where drivers are putting their pedal to the metal.

Fatal accidents are 4x more likely on rural roads as urban roads. Is it worth risking destroying so many lives for such minimal gains?

Even going up to 35mph doubles your chances of killing someone. Don't go beyond third gear! Do you hear?

Throughout May, the Community Speed Watch Group carried out 9 monitoring sessions, clocking up a total of 13 hours and 45 minutes. During this time, 38 drivers were reported to the police for exceeding the 30mph limit, bringing our running total to 580 since February 2024.

The highest speed recorded was at 55 mph between 7:00am-8:00am on Thursday, 21st May.

Dog Gone

Millennium Green is undergoing some changes over summer... The willow tree near the entrance has to be reduced as it is growing through the power lines. A section of fencing is being replaced in the car park, and a shaggy dogwood bush is being cut, to be transformed into a freshly coiffeured puppywood!

Play Park Patrol

Millennium Green will imminently have three CCTV cameras. Regular police patrols have been increased to stop youths congregating in this area. Along with the cutting back of the dogwood bush, it will reduce the appeal of loitering and littering near Lily's Play Park.

County Councillor Julian Kirk Update



Dear Constituents,

To recap what I have been up to during June, I have attended all parish council meetings scheduled.

I have had Leaders meetings and a meeting with the CEO in County Hall, Norwich. I have attended Leaders and CEO meetings in the King's Court, King's Lynn.

I met up with the Deputy Leader at BCKLWN for a walk about in King's Lynn. The council is asking councillors to transfer another two million pounds from the Town Deal fund to the Guildhall renovation. I had concerns, but the Deputy Leader has put my mind at rest. The National Trust is the owner of the Guildhall; and we have a long-term lease. My main concern was that money may have been removed from the King's Lynn waterfront. I have been campaigning for years to get better facilities for visiting pleasure craft. We need pumping out facilities, toilet and shower facilities and a ship chandler. I have been assured the money is still there. Currently neighbouring ports offer far better services.

In the Walton Highway, Walsoken, Walpole area we continue to have highway disruption due to large equipment being moved into the Walpole Substation. I fully understand constituents' concerns, but The Haulage Company and its staff have worked miracles manoeuvring a 32-axle trailer around corners.

I have been out with the Brush Cutter cutting grass around bus stops and dangerous corners.
